Board President's Message



Our Work Doesn't Stop

2020. The year of change, adaptability, and opportunity. It was a roller coaster of a year.

Little did we realize that a virus that was mentioned in late 2019, early 2020, would completely shut down "non-essential" businesses and make our livelihoods come to an almost screeching halt. On March 17, 2020, an Executive Order was issued that non-essential businesses were to close due to the COVID-19 pandemic. In response, Jackson Electric quickly enacted their Pandemic Plan, a document we thought we would never have to dust off.

The following day, March 18, Jackson Electric's lobby closed to walk-in traffic. Even though our lobby was closed, our work didn't stop. Our employees recognized that as more members were forced to stay home, their need for reliable power would be greater than ever. We adapted to new protocols to limit exposure between employees to ensure there would always be someone available to assist our members with their day-to-day needs and outage restoration.

Management alternated working remotely, the line crew worked four, 10-hour days with split crews, office employees maintained social distancing, and extra hygiene protocols were put in place. Alternative online and phone services were quickly developed for our members.

The hardships our members faced during the pandemic did not go unnoticed by Jackson Electric. Some of our members were out of work or had their work hours reduced, the same for the businesses in our service territory. They were either shut down or open for limited hours. In response, we stopped collections on past-due electric payments, waived late fees, worked with members on payment arrangements, and gave back nearly \$71,000 to members who had membership deposits on our books. We also quickly put together a zero to one percent economic development loan package to assist area small businesses.

Financial struggles hit Jackson Electric, as well. We still had a wholesale power bill and other bills to pay each month, and the lack of revenue from kilowatt-hour sales made it difficult. Our system encompasses nearly 49% of commercial load. Those businesses were shut down and the slight tick in residential sales did not make up for that loss in revenue. To help mitigate this financial disaster, each department suspended all expense projects until further notice.

During this unprecedented time, we supported our community and its needs. In February, we opened our warehouse facility to host the county's COVID-19 vaccination drive-through events. Our employees invested time with community partners and volunteers every Thursday for 10 weeks to provide a safe, comfortable, and convenient location for the public to receive vaccinations.

Here we are, a year later. Jackson Electric is still doing what we've always done, providing safe, reliable power for all generations. We used last year's ride as an opportunity to review our services and procedures, to find ways to improve our member service, and to revise our pandemic plan.

With that being said, we hope you're able to attend the virtual annual meeting. While we became somewhat accustomed to online meetings, we're hoping that our next annual meeting will be in-person to regain that personal connection with our membership.

Some say, "When handed lemons, you make lemonade." I'm not sure we made lemonade, but we did our best to continue our commitment to our membership in a year of challenges. That dedication and commitment will continue as we use what we learned during the pandemic to keep moving in a progressive direction to better serve our members.

83rd Annual Meeting of Jackson Electric Cooperative August 18, 2020, at 7:00 p.m.

- 1. The 83rd virtual Annual Meeting of Jackson Electric Cooperative was held at Jackson Electric Cooperative in Black River Falls, Wisconsin, on August 18, 2020, at 7:00 p.m. The meeting was broadcast on Facebook Live and on radio stations WWIS FM 105.3 and AM 1260. Members participated through Facebook Live and were able to call in with questions and comments. President Gary Woods called the meeting to order. Other board members present were Jerry Huber, David Peasley, Dan Smrekar, Kristi Hanson, Jerry Wagner, Chris Curran, Brian Huber, and Stan Gran. Jessica Shrestha, legal counsel, was present via Zoom.
- 2. President Woods led the Pledge of Allegiance.
- Gary Woods welcomed all who were viewing the meeting. After an introduction of the board of directors, President Woods ensured listeners that their elected directors serve the members' best interests. He discussed the challenges of decreasing kilowatt-hour sales. A rate study will be conducted to reevaluate the rate design of each of the rate classes. He also touched on the need for technology to improve labor and data gathering efficiencies.

President Woods recognized the Friends of the Black River Falls Library. They are the recipients of the \$1,000 Mike Anderson Memorial. He also recognized the youth ambassador scholarship recipient, Seth Peterson.

- 4. The reading of the Call and Notice of Meeting was conducted by Secretary David Peasley. It was announced a quorum was present and the meeting would proceed.
- Motion was made and seconded that Secretary David Peasley dispense with the reading of the minutes for the 2019 annual meeting and

approve as submitted. Motion carried unanimously.

- The Redistricting Report was presented by Director Dan Smrekar. He noted that all districts have approximately equal representation.
- The pre-recorded Audit Report was presented by Abby Williamson of CarlsonSV.
- On a motion duly made, seconded, and carried the following Resolution was approved, ratifying the director elections held for Districts 2, 3, and 8.

BE IT RESOLVED, that the election of Kristi Hanson as Director for District No. Two (2) on February 18, 2020, for a three-year term; the election of Jerry Huber as Director for District No. Three (3) on February 19, 2020, for a threeyear term; and the election of Dan Smrekar as Director for District No. Eight (8) on February 20, 2020, for a three-year term; be and the same are hereby ratified and confirmed.

- 9. A motion was duly made, seconded, and carried to ratify the virtual meeting process.
- 10. Old Business none.
- 11. New Business none.
- 12. No questions or comments were presented.
- 13. Meeting was adjourned at 7:20 p.m. without objection.

- 1. The meeting will be conducted in accordance with Roberts Rules of Order Newly Revised edition.
- 2. Any speaker must be recognized by the Chair before speaking.
- 3. Only members and duly registered guests will be recognized by the Chair; each person so recognized must give his or her name.
- 4. Unless otherwise approved by the Chair, those recognized are to limit their questions and comments to three minutes, with any rebuttal limited to two minutes.
- 5. Questions and comments from members and duly registered guests will be in order during old and new business sessions, and at the conclusion of the officer reports, if invited.
- 6. No resolution affecting Jackson Electric Cooperative may be submitted by any member, unless written copies have been received by Jackson Electric Cooperative by May 20, 2021. This will permit time for review by the Jackson Electric Cooperative Board of Directors to make its recommendation to the meeting as to approval or rejection.
- 7. No signs or handouts will be permitted within the building of the place of the meeting, except such handouts as required for the official conduct of the Annual Meeting. No handouts made available outside of the building will use the name of the Cooperative, its letterhead or logo to imply that the Cooperative supports or opposes any resolution.
- 8. No demonstrations shall be held within the building of the place of the meeting.

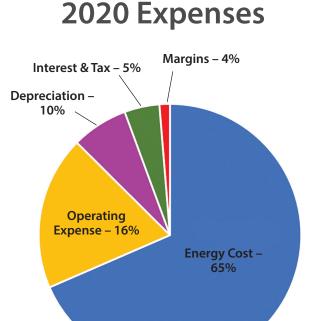
